COMMON MEDICAL ALERT & ID TOOLS

- Medical alert bracelets and necklaces
- Phone emergency medical profile (lock screen access)
- Seizure alert smart watches
- Continuous glucose monitors (CGM)
- Insulin pumps
- Emergency medical smartphone apps
- Implantable device ID cards

WHERE TO FIND MEDICAL INFORMATION ON THE PERSON

- Wrists (bracelets, smart watches, seizure alert devices)
- Neck (medical alert necklace)
- Waist/abdomen (insulin pump or glucose sensor)
- Wallet or purse (medical ID card, implant card)
- Phone lock screen (Emergency Medical Profile)
- Keychain medical ID tag
- Lanyards or badge clips (hospital or care facility)

FIELD RESPONSE CHECKLIST

- Visually check wrists, neck, and waistband immediately
- Check phone lock screen for medical profile
- Ask the subject or bystanders about known medical conditions
- Identify visible medical devices before applying restraints
- Document medical ID presence in reports
- Request EMS when any medical alert device is identified
